FROM TOM'S DESK

Just yesterday, I returned from two weeks on vacation. One of the places we went was Glacier National Park. We did a bus tour of the park. The bus tour was led by a Native American- a member of the Blackfeet nation to be exact. The tour quide's name was Kevin Kicking Woman. He told us that his grandmother was very tall, with very long legs- thus the name "Kicking Woman".

Kevin some insight into the Blackfeet Culture while he was leading the tour. He said something that stuck with me. He said that Blackfeet will ask themselves four questions every day: 1. Have I been humble today? 2. Have I been generous today? 3. Did I laugh today? 4. Did I cry today?

As I listened to him saying these things, I recognized some parallels with our own faith. First, the practice of a person reexamining their day has a storied history in the Christian tradition going back at least 500 years. Ignatius Loyola created a prayer discipline known as the examen for the Jesuit order he created. (continued next

In this practice, they do exactly the same thing that Kevin suggested. They reflect on their day. They ask themselves how their faith has impacted their daywhat they did that was good, what they did that was bad.

Secondly, the questions that Kevin asked are ones that we could all stand to ask. The bible says that we should be humble like Jesus. So, asking ourselves if we've been humble is a good question for us to ask ourselves. The bible says that we should give all that we have. So, asking ourselves if we've been generous is a good question to ask ourselves.

I can think of a few other questions we should ask ourselves. Have I been loving? Have I been faithful? Have I been I been forgiving? Have I been accepting of others. Have I been gracious? Have I been peaceful and joyful? Have I been kind and gentle? Have I acted with self-control? The bible calls these things the fruits of the spirit. Asking these questions helps keep us aligned with the will of God?

Let me encourage you to consider making the examen a part of your prayer regimen. If you want some help with it, let me know.
