FROM TOM'S DESK

Let me ask you a question. Do you know how God is calling you to minister? If the answer to that is no, you're not alone. My experience has taught me that most people don't. In fact, if you have pondered that question at all, you're ahead of the game.

The bible says that each of us receives gifts from the Holy Spirit. Those gifts are meant to be used in the service of the Kingdom of God. Yet, it amazes me how little time we spend discovering and developing those gifts. What amazes me even more is that the church universal spends very little time focusing on developing those gifts. Let me give you an example of what I'm talking about.

Let's imagine a person who is a dedicated prayer warrior. They are constantly in prayer. Typically, the questions I have heard the church ask about such persons are the same questions I would have heard about anyone else. Do they attend worship regularly? Do they give regularly and generously? Are they serving on committees?

The questions I think we *should* be asking about this person are different; they are different from the questions I just asked; they are different from the questions I would ask about other people who have other gifts.

Here are the questions I would ask an obvious prayer warrior. Are you praying only for people whom you know, or are you praying for others? There are people in our congregation, at your work, and in your neighborhood who struggle to pray- are you teaching them to pray? Are you leading a prayer group? Are you even attending a prayer group?

Again, these are the type questions I would have for someone with the gift of prayer. I would have different questions for the person with the gift of teaching. I would have yet another set of questions for a person with the gift of counseling, or the gift of leadership, or the gift of evangelism. The point is that we should all be identifying and using our gifts. I hope you will take some time to consider yours.
